



KSU TO TOWN CENTER MALL MULTI-USE PATH

The KSU to Mall multi-use path project was developed to assist in completing a bicycle and pedestrian connection from the heart of the Kennesaw State University campus to Town Center Mall. The project will construct a shared-use path to begin at the previously built multi-use trail at the Skip Spann Connector, move south along the western side of Busbee Drive, cross over Chastain Road and continue south to the CCT Transit Station. This 0.5 mile trail will connect to the planned GRTA expansion and existing trail, heading east, along Big Shanty. From the Town Village Residential area, the trail continues south through the future Town Center Park connecting to the mall.

FEATURES:

The proposed trail is 13 feet wide in most sections and narrows to 10 feet wide in some areas. Landscaping and lighting will be added in a future phase.

This trail will provide an important north/south connection and a safe alternate route for cyclists and pedestrians. One of the most significant impacts will be to KSU students and other campus visitors, creating a route to and from KSU's main campus and designated parking facilities, to the busy Fifth Third Bank Stadium for games and community events.
