



NOONDAY CREEK TRAIL

The Noonday Creek Trail is located in northern Cobb County. It is a seven-mile trail stretching from the Bells Ferry Trailhead to the Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park, with more than five miles located within the CID boundary. Visioning for the project began in 2000 with the idea of creating an infrastructure connection for alternative modes of travel and recreation while winding through the existing natural areas in the district. The trail is a 12-foot wide, hard surface path with multiple bridges crossing Noonday Creek. It winds through flood plains and forested areas, under highway overpasses and along roadsides. This trail allows users to see the district from many vantage points. The reality of Noonday Creek Trail was a combined effort of the Town Center CID, Cobb County, GDOT and the National Park Service.

FEATURES:

- Access to Kennesaw Mountain National Battlefield Park and Visitor Center
- Two restrooms and parking lots located along the trail (Bells Ferry Trailhead and Aviation Park)
- One passive park with playground and shade structure located along the trail (Aviation Park)
- Access to Founders Park

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
